



SCHEDULE OF COMPETITION CLASSES

HOW TO ENTER

All entries should be made online at www.worcestershow.org.uk via the online entry form.

Just click 'Enter the Show' or find the Competition Classes tab.

If you do not have access to the internet, please visit our Customer Service Centre at the Guildhall, High Street, Worcester for help or call them on 01905 722233.

ENTRIES

An exhibitor may only enter ONE exhibit in each class.

Children may enter any section however they will be judged alongside adults, unless stated in the section details.

DEADLINES

To enter, please use the online form no later than 10am on 3 August 2026.

Trophies should be returned to the Guildhall, High Street, Worcester, WR1 2EY no later than Saturday 18 July 2026.

STAGING

Please bring all entries to the Competition Marquee, for display between 8.30am to 11.30am on Saturday 8 August to be judged at 11.45am.

Cacti & Succulents (Section 2) ONLY may be staged on either the Saturday 8 August between 8.30am and 11.30am OR Sunday 9 August between 7.30am and 9am ready to be judged at 9.15am on Sunday.

Floral (Section 1) ONLY will be staged on Sunday 9 August between 7.30am and 9am ready to be judged at 9.15am on Sunday.

Your entry must not be removed, rearranged or interfered with once judging has commenced.

SCORING AND PRIZES

- Shields will be awarded to the winner and runner up of the Schools competition, engraved and displayed at the Guildhall. The students will receive a cup for the school.
- Points will be awarded in each class as follows; 1st = 3 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point
- Any entry not in accordance with the schedule rules, may be disqualified by the judges
- All exhibits entering the competition must have been grown or produced the piece/s. (Excluding Cacti & Succulents (Section 2) and Floral Decorations & Art (Section 6))
- No Entry is allowed by any craft exhibit that you have entered in a previous Worcester Show.
- Medals will be awarded in each class, no prize money will be awarded unless it is a prize in a sponsored class.
- If there is only one entry in a class, this does not mean it will receive 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize automatically, this will be up to the judges' discretion.
- Prizes will be awarded in sponsored classes as stated & marked.
- Prizes in any class may be withdrawn at the discretion of the judges.
- A trophy will be awarded to the 'Under 18s, Best in Show' and overall 'Best in Show'. These are based on the total number of points accumulated by an individual exhibitor.
- A trophy will be awarded for each Section, to the exhibitor with the most points.
- An additional trophy will be awarded for the 'Best in Section' in the following class sections: Photography & Handicraft. This is not based on points, this is to be awarded to the 'exceptional entry' as deemed by the judge in the chosen section.
- **In the event of a tie on points between exhibitors, it will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining most 1st prizes. If they tie on the same amount of 1st prizes, it will go to the exhibitor with the most 2nd prizes.**

Trophies will be engraved and displayed at the Guildhall. Winners will receive a cup to take home. All winners must agree to return cups to the Guildhall by the third week in July.

OPENING TIMES & COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

The Competition marquee will be open at 10am on Sunday.

Entries can only be removed from the show on Sunday 9 August after 5pm. Every reasonable care shall be taken of any exhibitors property, and Worcester Show does not hold responsibility.

I – SECTION RULES

Please read section rules very carefully. Failure to comply may lead to disqualification.

All exhibits must be the property of, and cultivated by, the exhibitor.

Exhibitors must provide their own vases, pots etc.

Pot plants and bonsai trees must be in the ownership of the exhibitor for at least six months prior to the show.

Pot plants may be indoor or outdoor varieties.

The use of plastic based floral foam (oasis) is strictly forbidden. Entries found to be using it may not be judged. Eco alternatives will be accepted, please leave a note with your exhibit if this is the case.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

Display the name of the variety of the exhibit; if the variety is unknown then the exhibit should be marked “unknown”.

JUDGING

Judges will look for meritorious and defective features. The Worcester Show aims to encourage the competitive spirit amongst amateurs. Therefore the 'professional' judging using a points system will not be used but Judges can refer to the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook guide to organising, judging and competing in a show'.

'Succulent' means any succulent plant other than a cactus.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

The Co-Operative Society Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Cacti & Succulents section.

Please note the Cacti & Succulents Section will be judged on Sunday 9 August.

Vegetables & Fruit will be judged as per the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook.

Roots of non-root vegetables must be gently washed clean and should be no more than 100mm (4”) long.

All root vegetables should be cleaned gently, with tops trimmed to no more than 75mm (3”)

Exhibitors must provide their own plates, baskets, etc.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

Display the name of the variety of the exhibit; if the variety is unknown then the exhibit should be marked “unknown”.

JUDGING

Judges will look for meritorious and defective features. The Worcester Show aims to encourage the competitive spirit amongst amateurs. Therefore the ‘professional’ judging using a points system will not be used but Judges can refer to the ‘RHS Horticultural Show Handbook’ guide to organising, judging and competing in a show’.

Display the name of the variety of the exhibit; if the variety is unknown then the exhibit should be marked “unknown”.

Vegetables in this section must be longer / larger than your entries in Section 3.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

JUDGING

Judges will look for meritorious and defective features. The Worcester Show aims to encourage the competitive spirit amongst amateurs. Therefore the ‘professional’ judging using a points system will not be used but Judges can refer to the ‘RHS Horticultural Show Handbook’ guide to organising, judging and competing in a show’.

Class 505	A pedestal arrangement (please specify on application whether it is table or floor mounted). Must be on a raised platform or container.

5 – SECTION RULES

Please read section rules very carefully. Failure to comply may lead to disqualification.

All exhibits will be displayed on a table; table depth is approximately 610mm.

Displays may be partially assembled before staging in the Show marquee.

Only completed displays to be placed on the show bench. Extra tables will be provided for staging.

Flowers in all classes need not be grown by the exhibitor.

Accessories are allowed unless otherwise stated.

The use of plastic based floral foam (oasis) is strictly forbidden. Entries found to be using it may not be judged. Eco alternatives will be accepted, please leave a note with your exhibit if this is the case.

The Novice Class may be entered by anyone who has NOT won a first place prize in Floral Decorations/Art at the Worcester Show.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

The Duckworth Worcestershire Trust Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Floral Decorations/Art class section.

Please note, the Floral Decorations/Art Section will be staged and judged on Saturday 8 August.

6 – CAKES AND BAKES

Class 602	One Victoria sandwich cake (raspberry jam filling, caster sugar dusting and using a sponge tin no larger than 200mm diameter). Recipe to be stated. (250mm max overall display size)
Class 603	Cake for a special diet (max size 200mm diameter, 250mm max overall display size). Special diet to be displayed and recipe stated.
Class 604	New A Swiss roll filled with jam and dusted with castor sugar.
Class 605	Six savoury scones (250mm max overall display size).
Class 606	A box of sweet cookies. Presented as a gift but able to be opened for judging, with two extra pieces for tasting.
Class 607	A decorative container of homemade confectionery with two extra on a plate for tasting.
Class 608	New Six butterfly cakes (to be judged on both taste and decoration)
Class 609	A batch of six brown rolls or six white rolls
Class 610	A fancy loaf, decorated or shaped
Class 611	A dessert incorporating pastry. State whether pastry is home made or shop bought.
Class 612	A savoury pastry. State whether pastry is home made or shop bought.
Class 613	Six identical jam tarts. State whether jam is home made or shop bought.

6 – SECTION RULES

Please read section rules very carefully. Failure to comply may lead to disqualification.

All exhibits must be made by the exhibitor including homemade pastries, breads, pizza bases etc.

Exhibitors must provide own plate and cover for exhibit (excluding jars or bottles).

In the interests of food safety, no meat, fish or fresh cream to be used in any dish.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

The Worcester In Bloom Andrew Baynham Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Cakes & Preserves Class section.

Please note, the Cakes & Bakes Section will be staged and judged on Saturday 8 August.

All exhibits must be made by the exhibitor.

Jars may be reused but jars and lids showing trade names are not acceptable.

All preserves must have new twist top lids or a waxed disc and cellophane cover.

Labels should be stuck to the jar and not loose tied.

Full date of making is required on the label.

Vinegar proof lids should be used for chutneys and pickles.

An exhibitor may only enter one exhibit per class.

Please note, the Preserves Section will be staged and judged on Saturday 8 August.

14 – SCHOOLS

Class 1401	The Pershore College Worcester Schools Garden Competition - Open to all schools in Worcester with a school allotment / garden which will be judged by a qualified RHS judge. The school will also need to produce for exhibition at the Show an A3 Display (landscape) showing off the best bits about your garden, please label/annotate photos.
Class 1402	New An allotment or garden in a seed tray
Class 1403	New A Bug House, must be able to be displayed on a standard table.
Class 1404	New A scrapbook diary of your garden showing the changes in the calendar year.
Class 1405	New An arrangement of produce from your garden displayed in a basket or trug.

Open to all schools in Worcester with school garden involvement, with your entry being measured against a standardised set of criteria.

We will be looking at your school's achievements for your Allotment/Garden, the level of involvement of your pupils. The cultivation, environmental and educational aspects of the garden are all important, as is your pupils relationship with it, and their horticultural & biodiversity learning experiences.

Application form submission deadline – Friday 26 March 2026.

Three sections will be judged:

1401 – THE SCHOOL GARDEN OR ALLOTMENT

The Allotment / garden will be visited by a qualified Judge (RHS) during the Summer Term. Timings will be planned and agreed to avoid half-term and exam periods.

The Judge will rank the schools first to last. This will be supported with a short appraisal of each site.

CLASS 1402 AN ALLOTMENT IN A SEED TRAY

Create your dream allotment or garden in a seed tray. This can be done collaboratively as a group or by individuals. This class can be submitted in advance to the Guildhall, or exhibited on the day. Please note, if submitting in advance, do not include living plants as we can not be responsible for watering. If you use living plants, exhibits will need to be staged by students or staff on Show day.

CLASS 1403 A BUG HOUSE

Build a bug house, be as creative as you like! Please ensure your bug house is suitable for display on a table in the marquee, the base should not to exceed 610mm x 610mm.

CLASS 1404 A SCRAPBOOK DIARY

These should tell the Story of the Garden through the gardening year.

CLASS 1405 AN ARRANGEMENT OF PRODUCE

An arrangement of produce grown in your allotment/garden, designed in either a trug or basket

DEADLINES

Entry form and objectives to be submitted by Friday 27 March 2026 to allow adequate time for planning and carrying out site visits during the second half of the Summer Term.

Allotment plot or garden visit in the summer, whilst schools are still in session. To be arranged.

Show Display (for garden competition) to be submitted no later than Friday 17 July 2026 to the Guildhall, High Street, Worcester, WR1 2EY.

Classes 1402 to 1405 can be submitted to the Guildhall, High Street, Worcester, WR1 2EY no later than Friday 17 July 2026; OR staged on Saturday 8 August 2026 by students or staff between 8.30am and 11.30am.
